Our TV screens have been inundated with dramatic pictures of devastation caused by natural disaster. The recent flash flooding in Nepal being the latest example. As the surge of water captured on camera comes crashing down the valley, thousands of people are helplessly trapped as this torrent of water sweeps through, taking everything in its path. Pope Francis reminded us that creation is not merely a resource to be used but a sacred gift from God, entrusted to humanity for nurturing and protection. He stresses that humans are called to be 'protectors' of creation, respecting all creatures and the environment and recognising the beauty and order inherent in God's plan for the world. This stewardship is a moral and spiritual duty, rooted in love and obedience to God's commandment.
